Classroom & garden education (In schools, with Thrive & virtual)

2,103 in-person contact hours with more than 1,061 students
21 virtual learning videos produced with 2,476 views



Farm to School Summer Camps

2,280 camper contact hours. Of parents surveyed: 86% of campers had increased knowledge about gardening; 79% had increased interest in gardening; 71.% had increased knowledge about cooking.



Family Cooking Nights (In-person & virtual)

185 attendees; 100% of families began making healthier food choices
18 cooking videos produced with 3,292 views



Seed Packet distribution with the Gallatin Valley Food Bank

More than 1,100 seed packets and planting information given to 138 families so they could plant their own gardens



Whittier School Garden Expansion

Built and installed 11 raised beds with 158 square feet of garden, approximately doubling capacity



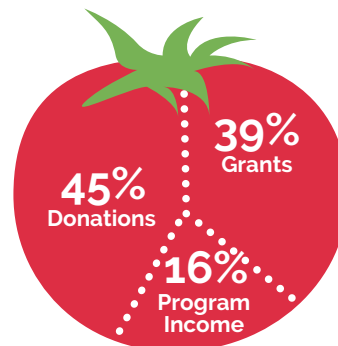
Whittier Wildcat Grocery+ Supplemental CSA

Utilized existing produce from school garden and greenhouse to provide vegetables to more than 15 families during remote learning

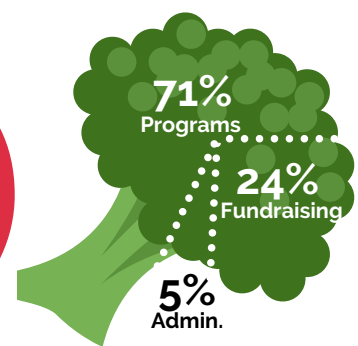
