2022 was a year of reinvigoration and growth. Like many organizations, the last few years came with program interruptions, adaptations, and organizational shifts due to the pandemic. Our team was determined, then and now, to keep serving the community despite the circumstances. And, over the past year, thanks to your support, we have truly begun to blossom again.

Once on indefinite hiatus during the pandemic, Bob the Greenhouse Bus returned to the road in the spring of 2022, carrying a garden to kids throughout the Valley. Our educators are bringing learning to life through local food in schools from Bozeman to Belgrade and Monforton to Willow Creek.

We welcomed over 900 community members at the Fall Farm to School Feastival, and partnered with more than 60 organizations and businesses to bring programs to locations across the county. Local students are eating and enjoying more Montana products on the lunch line, and we continue to lay the foundations for a nourishing future.

2023 will be Gallatin Valley Farm to School's 15th year building connections and nourishing our community, and we have big plans: expanded programs, deepened partnerships, and much more delicious food. We hope you'll join us.

2022 Program Impact Highlights

Garden & Classroom Lessons

Aligned to state & NGSS learning standards, GV Farm to School's garden & classroom lessons enrich classroom learning by utilzing a place-based and hands-on curriculum focused on celebrating Montana grown food. During the 2021-2022 school year, after participating:

- 79% of students liked trying new food
- 83% of students knew where they can purchase local food in town





Family Programming

GV Farm to School's Family Programs are offered on a sliding-scale and bring the entire family together to learn new cooking skills, how to cook on a budget, and how to incorporate kids into the meal decision and cooking process.

- 642 Contact Hours across 13 partner organizations and schools in Gallatin County
- 77% of partner organizations and schools signed up for more than one Family Program in 2022

2022 Program Impact Highlights (Cont.)

Summer and Schools-Out Camps

GV Farm to School's camps combine creativity, inquiry, and peer-learning to create a fun learning environment where kids can explore local food, agriculture, science, & cooking. After participating:

- 90% of students knew how to make good choices about the food they eat
- 92% of students knew how to make nutritional snacks for themselves
- 96% of students knew local farmers, and local foods, are important for our community



Afterschool Programming

GV Farm to School's Afterschool Program provides childcare and enriching food literacy education to children who's families need to work.

- 592 Contact Hours at schools across the county
- Expanded afterschool programming to partners in Gateway, Belgrade, and Bozeman

Mobile Programming: BOB


BOB is a mobile teaching that is able to bring garden education directly to those who may not otherwise have access to a garden.


